And that the same John should kill his ewe which is causing nuisance to the tenants under the aforesaid penalty

**Amercement ijd [2d]**

And that Richard<sup>ijd [2d]</sup> Lacy has common trespassed in the sown fields, with his plough. Therefore he is amerced. And that none are permitted to trespass with their ploughs over the gores<sup>2</sup> of the township, under the above penalty.

**Amercement xviijd**

And that Agnes<sup>vjd [6d]</sup> Cole, Alisia<sup>vjd [6d]</sup> Yarewey, Agnes<sup>vjd [6d]</sup> Pareys were brewers and broke the assize. Therefore they are amerced.
